This is a pretty good result except for the pictures. In many cases the pictures are wider than the page width and look half missing. The solution to quickly and easily address the image width problem in bulk is to create a Word macro to resize all images in a Word document that are too wide to fit on the page. Here's how we create the Word macro (this is in Outlook 2016) The Developer toolbar needed for creating macros isn't visible by default so to switch it on to File | Options | Customize Ribbon and ensure Developer toolbar appearing Select Macros, give the new macro a name and select a scope for where to save the macro (this determines where it will be available later on). This assumes the pages are in portrait orientation and that the maximum width of an image should be 15cm
